Construction employment opportunities

Construction of the Coastal GasLink project is currently underway by our five prime contractors across the 670-kilometre right-of-way to meet our planned inservice date of 2023.

Construction activities include access road development, right-of-way clearing and grading, gravel processing, preparation of workforce accommodations and storage sites, pipe stringing, welding, pipe installation, site cleanup, and reclamation.

Employment opportunities and qualifications required to undertake these activities include:

- Entry level jobs Labourers, skilled and administrative positions. Previous pipeline-related experience not required. On-the-job training will be provided.
- Trades In addition to completing Grade 12, trades require certification or enrollment in an approved apprenticeship program. Skilled labour positions require some experience in the relevant field.
- Technical and professional jobs Technical positions generally require a certificate or diploma from a technical institute in fields such as mechanical and instrumentation. Professional positions generally require a university degree or a technical institute diploma such as engineering, environmental studies or occupational health and safety.

All individuals must have a commitment to safety, and the ability to work in a team environment. Workers must undergo drug and alcohol testing.

Contracting opportunities

Not only will construction create thousands of high-quality jobs, there will also be increased demand for the use of local goods and services, including things like construction and maintenance equipment, food and accommodation, hardware, fuel, equipment servicing and more.

Much of the total construction cost will be spent in B.C., with a commitment to providing opportunities to Indigenous and local businesses.

Coastal GasLink works closely with Indigenous and local communities, businesses and economic development

organizations to identify opportunities for local businesses to participate in the project. Together with our prime contractors and local unions, we are committed to ensuring that all contracting opportunities meet the highest safety standards.


