
Public Health Order revised paving way for summer construction ramp-up

On April 13, Northern Health and B.C.'s Provincial Health Officer **revised the provisions** of the Provincial Health Officer's (PHO) **Order on Industrial Projects** requiring workforce limits. With this change, Coastal GasLink field workforce numbers can increase to advance progress on the project through the summer under our enhanced **COVID-19 Management Plan**. Our 'Graphic of the Month' (see last page) provides insight into planned construction focus areas in the coming months, subject to change as the Coastal GasLink team finalizes remobilization plans for the summer construction program.

While project construction typically sees a slow-down during spring break-up, the Coastal GasLink team did achieve a

significant milestone on March 29: the completion of 692 km of pipe delivered along the 670-km project route with zero safety incidents! Look for details on this achievement on **CoastalGasLink.com** soon.

With several milestones achieved on the project and more to come, Coastal GasLink continues to be vital to the longterm prosperity of the North, B.C. and Canada. Across the project, significant progress has been made to ensure the project moves through spring freshet in an environmentallyresponsible manner to prepare for the summer construction program. Working with our prime contractors and Indigenous and local community partners, we remain focused on delivering this project safely and efficiently.

- Continued safety and environmentally-critical pipe tie-ins
- Continued Erosion and Sediment Control (ESC) mitigation

- Complete ESC mitigation and continue monitoring through spring break-up
- Complete critical pipeline tie-in works and remaining timber removal from construction corridor before demobilization for spring break-up
- Drone, burning and controlled blasting activities as required

Wilde Lake Compressor Station Key activities

- Critical activities related to equipment preservation, material deliveries, environmental monitoring and security
- Environmental monitoring continued
- Preservation and maintenance of critical compressor package equipment
- Offsite fabrication (piping and structural steel) progressing

- Continued ESC monitoring
- Receive fabrication loads at site for safe storage
- Equipment preservation for critical compressor components
- Construction remobilization to site planned for May 2021



- Completed pipe receipt at Section 2 storage areas
- Continued ESC mitigation
- Continued clearing and grading works to mitigate environmental impacts of these activities during wildfire season
- Continued development of Mt. Merrick Lodge






