Coastal GasLink Pipeline Project



Construction highlights

Clearing the way! Construction of the Coastal GasLink Project is currently focused on right-of-way clearing in Sections 1, 2, 3 and 8 with 14 per cent of the total route cleared to date. Rain and snow conditions are posing unfavorable conditions leading to clearing delays in some areas. In Section 8, a cable crane is under construction to assist with worker access and pipe installation along a steep section of the route, minimizing land disturbance in the surrounding mountainous terrain.

Despite weather challenges, several milestones were recently achieved including the opening of the Sukunka Lodge site in Section 2. Sukunka Lodge will house hundreds of workers in fall 2020 when pipeline installation will be in full swing.

The approximately 150 workers currently at this site have access to a gym, a lounge and 24-hour snack-bar in addition to cell service and wifi to keep in touch with loved ones.

Looking ahead, pipe delivery is scheduled for December for Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 7 and 8 stockpile sites. Learn more through our pipeline construction fact sheet on **CoastalGasLink.com**.




Construction progress:

- Continued road and bridge upgrades along the route, including road brushing to decrease the height of vegetation to maintain a safe line of sight
- Earthwork activity at Chetwynd workforce accommodation site to establish multi-use facilities such as offices
- Due to muddy conditions, halted right-of-way clearing on various days in October
- Permitting received to clear route on specified parts of Section 1

- Right-of-way and ditch blasting activities as required by right-of-way conditions
- Burning of cleared vegetation not suitable for repurposing (e.g. logging) until the end of December; a timing extension may be required
- Continue clearing pending favourable weather conditions for approved areas
- *All schedules are subject to change

- Due to muddy conditions, halted right-of-way clearing on various days in October

Construction progress:

- Continued road and bridge upgrades along the route, including road brushing to decrease the height of vegetation to maintain a safe line of sight where permits and agreements allow
- Due to rainy and wet conditions, clearing progress has slowed to avoid mixing topsoil and subsoil in compliance with environmental plans and regulatory permits
- Permitting received, with conditions, to clear route on specified parts of Section 3 between KP 172 and 244

- Right-of-way and blasting activities as required until December 2019 by right-of-way conditions between KP 172 and 200
- Continue clearing pending favorable weather conditions
- Stringing and bending pipe at stockpile sites to occur over the winter months
- *All schedules are subject to change



Construction progress:

- Clearing activities planned to commence mid-November between KP 262 and 330
- 70 workers currently at the 5B workforce accommodation, a temporary workforce accommodation site in use until end of January 2020 to assist with Section 3 and 4 clearing

Upcoming activities*:

- Stringing and bending pipe at stockpile sites to occur over the winter months
- * All schedules are subject to change




workers at Little Rock Lake Lodge



Construction progress:

- Commenced right-of-way clearing activities on week of November 4 with multiple crews
- Little Rock Lake Lodge workforce accommodation in operation to support early right-of-way clearing works
- Tie-in of community water line completed

- Commence right-of-way preparation
- Little Rock Lake Lodge workforce accommodation site to welcome additional workers

Construction progress:

- Clearing completed for 7 Mile Road workforce accommodation site and Laydown 28
- Environmental field studies for pre-construction ongoing

Upcoming activities*:

- · Continue early site preparation works
- Continue preparation for clearing works in January 2020
- Finish grading activity on 7 Mile Road workforce accommodation site and Laydown 28
- Continue 7 Mile Road workforce accommodation site mobilization and installation activities



Construction progress:

- Temporary use permit for Huckleberry workforce accommodation site received
- Environmental field studies for pre-construction ongoing

Upcoming activities*:

- Continue early site preparation work
- Continue preparation for clearing scheduled for January 2020
- Start clearing and grading work on Huckleberry workforce accommodation site
- Pipe delivery at the Houston Stockpile site scheduled for December
- *All schedules are subject to change

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

Construction progress:

- Due to rainy and poor right-ofway conditions, one crew diverted to erosion and sediment control works during October
- Ongoing clearing and erosion control, with blasting as required
- Foundations complete for cable crane located at KP 625

Upcoming activities*:

- Progress crane tower preparation and winterization commences
- Pipe delivery at the North Kitimat Stockpile site scheduled for December
- Continue clearing work to extent possible for remainder of construction season
- Commence expansion of Hunter Creek and 9A, and preparation for Icy 1 and Icy 2 workforce accommodation sites for clearing and pipe installation work

Sukunka Lodge is the first workforce accommodation site to be established in the South Peace Region, which encompasses Sections 1 and 2 of the Coastal GasLink Project.

About the Project

The Coastal GasLink Project is a 670-kilometre provincially regulated pipeline that will safely deliver natural gas from the eastern part of B.C. near Dawson Creek to the LNG Canada facility in Kitimat, B.C.

The project is designed to meet some of the strictest environmental and safety standards in the world. Coastal GasLink is under construction today and is delivering significant benefits to communities across the province.
