Coastal GasLink continues to ramp up with more activity — and more workers — across the project right-of-way.

Kitimat Direct Pipe Installation complete

Protecting water and aquatic life throughout construction and into operations is paramount and we use state-of-the-art technology and methods to help us do that. **Direct Pipe Installation (DPI)** is a highly specialized trenchless construction method that installs pipe underneath a waterway and in late August, we completed the first DPI near Kitimat, located on the west end of the Coastal GasLink route. DPI installations along the Coastal GasLink route will vary from 325 metres to 535 metres in length. Find out more about water crossings at **CoastalGasLink.com**.

Clearing underway along the entire right-of-way

The **first stage of pipeline construction** — clearing — is now officially underway (and complete in some locations) along all sections of the right-of-way. In August, Section 7 joined in clearing activities along the Coastal GasLink route.

Workforce accommodations operational in all eight sections

This month marks the first time workforce accommodations in each of our sections are operational with Sanataa Lodge (Section 1) and Huckleberry Lodge (Section 7) welcoming Coastal GasLink workforce members. A new and unique program - the Community Workforce Accommodation Advisor (CWAA) Program — is being launched at new and existing sites to enhance the experience of workers and provide opportunities for neighboring Indigenous communities. 

Key activities:

- Sanataa Lodge opening
- Mainline pipe activities commenced
- Continued access, clearing, grubbing and grading
- Pipe crossing under Highway 97 and a CN railroad track completed

Look ahead*:

- Ongoing environment and erosion control management
- Continued access road upgrades including Road 269 heading north of Highway 97 for 2.5 km until mid-October
- Reduced traffic speeds on Lone Prairie road from September 17-25 to accommodate construction activity between KP 6 and 6.4
- · Continued grading activities
- Ongoing clearing and pipe installation; increased pipe delivery traffic between storage sites and the right-of-way
- Drone and controlled blasting activities as required
- Ongoing pipe installation





- Begin preparations for Crooked River DPI
- Increased traffic from storage sites to route to transport pipe
- Drone and controlled blasting activities as required
- Pipe stringing beginning mid-October; welding beginning late-October

Key activities:

- Completed Vanderhoof Lodge construction

- Ongoing pipeline installation along right-of-way; begin lowering in pipe
- Road and bridge upgrades as required
- Increased traffic from storage sites to route to transport pipe
- Drone activities as required

Did you know?

Welding is the fourth of the eight stages of pipeline construction. Welders join pipe segments together and each weld is inspected and certified using X-ray or ultrasonic technology. The **entire process** for installing segments of pipe can happen over a few days to weeks, including backfilling the trench.

- · Ongoing erosion and sediment control monitoring, as well as access works
- Pipe delivered to area storage sites
- Expansion of Little Rock Lake Lodge underway

Look ahead*:

- Begin mainline pipe installation activities in September 2020
- Ongoing sediment and erosion control and completion of storage sites to accommodate pipe and material arrival
- Continue work on expanding Little Rock Lake Lodge
- Grubbing and grading along right-of-way
- Access works
- Increased pipe delivery traffic between storage sites and the right-of-way
- Drone activities as required

Did you know?

Coastal GasLink uses drones to survey route topography for clearing activities. Drones provide an efficient and unobtrusive way to view the project corridor including conditions and terrain. Look ahead*:

- Continue access, grubbing, grading and pipe stringing works
- Commence pipe bending and welding
- Complete remaining clearing areas and log hauling
- Complete main phase of 7 Mile Lodge construction as required
- Increased traffic from storage sites to route to transport pipe
- Drone and controlled blasting activities as required

Clearing on the Section 7 rightof-way means that all Coastal GasLink sections now have route clearing underway, or in some cases, like Section 5, completed.



- Ongoing road maintenance as well as erosion and sediment control

- Continue right-of-way preparation such as clearing, drone and controlled blasting activities as required
- Continue grading
- Continue development at 9A Lodge
- Pipe installation to continue at LNG Canada connector site; increased traffic from storage sites to route to transport pipe
